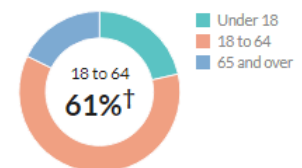

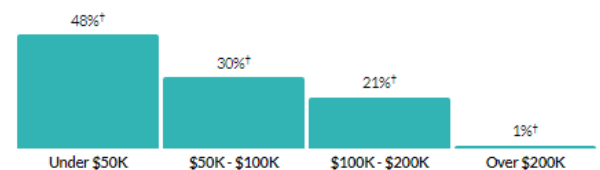

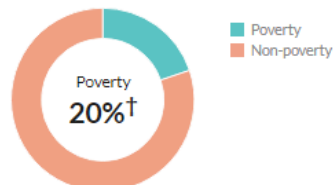

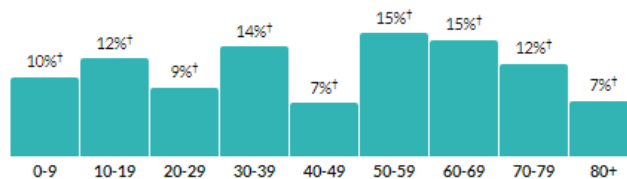

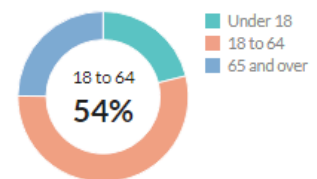

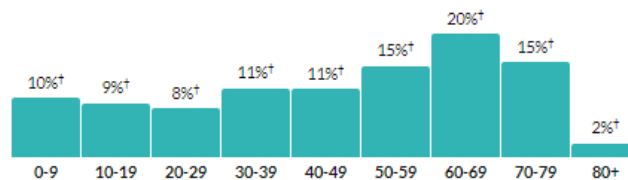

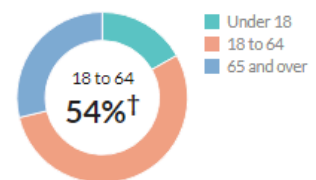

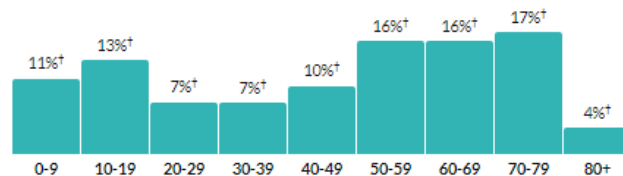

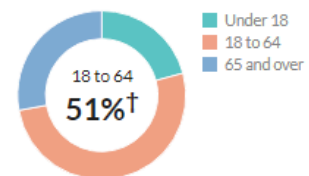

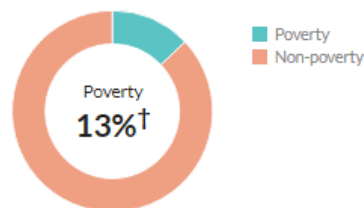

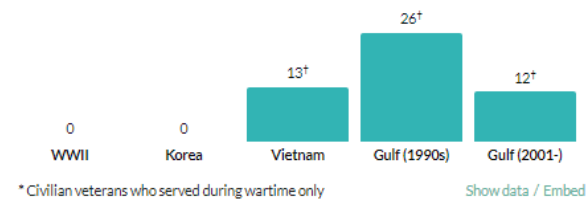

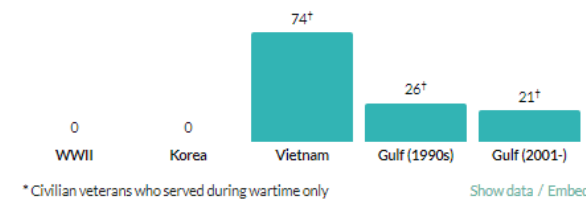

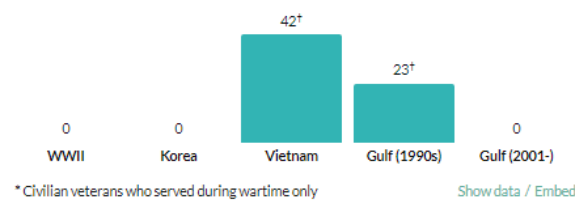

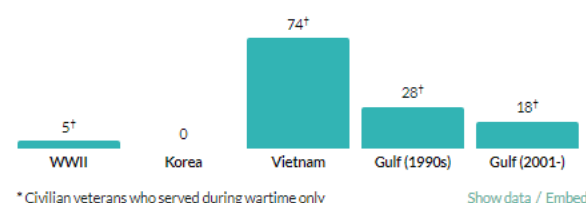

Snapshot of Library Services

Since the last Strategic Plan, beginning in 2020, the library has achieved all of its proposed goals and seen significant growth. A major contributor to this growth was the completion and opening of the new Library facility in August of 2020. The new library is situated less than a block from Main Street, North Adams, Michigan, and is only two doors down from the North Adams Jerome Public Schools.

The new Library building is 3,456 square feet, and the added space has allowed for the following improvements: additional comfortable seating areas, study tables, a separate Children's Room, a room devoted to Local History and archival records, designated office space and a staff break room, a private parking lot, handicapped parking/ramp and public restrooms.

Additionally, the Library is the only local site providing public technology access. It provides public access computers, faxing and printing services, and free Wi-Fi. A Library cardholder is also able to access a vast array of online content, including online eBooks, Audiobooks, and Magazines. There is access to over 400 other Michigan library collections and resources through the MeLCat sharing platform, allowing patrons to borrow from millions of items in a variety of formats statewide. Finally, there are online educational resources available through the Library, including, but not limited to, MeLCat e Resources, Libby, Tutor.com, Mango Languages, ABC Mouse.com, Ancestry Library Edition, and so much more.

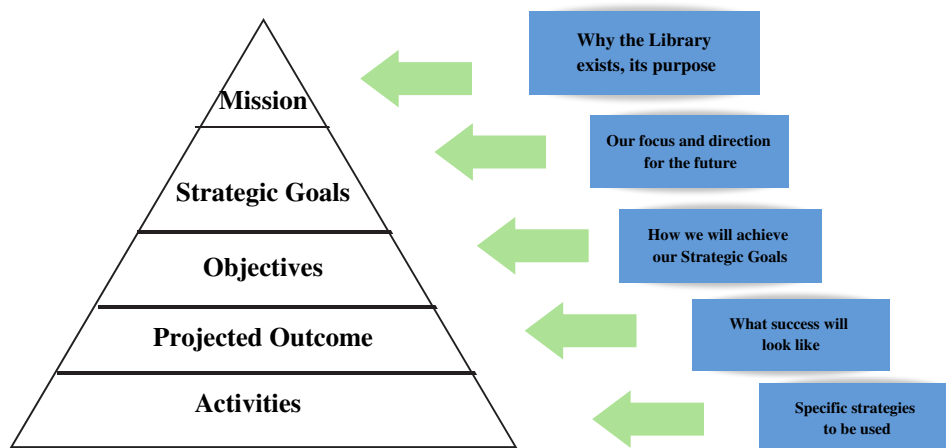

The following graphic depicts the organization of the North Adams Community Memorial Library's activities and operations as a direct foundation supporting the overall Mission for this valuable civic resource. We plan and operate with a clear purpose, developed through our community-based strategic planning process.



About the Library

The North Adams Community Memorial Library is located at 4695 Knowles Road in the Village of North Adams, Michigan. It is a district library, providing services to all residents living within the Village of North Adams, Adams Township, and Moscow Township. Wheatland Township has contracted with the library to provide services to its' residents (not within the Hudson School District). Services are available to all others for an annual fee. The library is currently funded by a 0.9 millage, State Aid Funding, Penal Fines, and donations.

History

North Adams Community Memorial Library opened in 1921, serving the residents of Adams and Moscow Townships, and the Village of North Adams. After WWII, the library was established as a place to memorialize local veterans of foreign wars. Since it first opened, the library has continued expanding its reach and offerings by adding services in 1983 to Wheatland Township residents and by opening a new facility in 2020.

Mission Statement

Our mission is to offer resources and services to help community residents obtain information meeting their personal, educational and professional needs. We offer a wide variety of resources and programs for social and cultural enhancement. We strive to honor and memorialize local veterans through our local history collection. We exist to foster a love of reading, curiosity, and life-long learning.
